Greetings from Espere Kay!

Dearest friends, we would like to begin this month's newsletter with a brief discussion about becoming Manman ak Papa (Mom and Dad) to eight young adult orphans in Haiti. Most of the young adults here at EK have no living parents. The three who do have a parent have only moms who are unfit to care for them. Although all the young adults lived at Loving Hands Orphanage while they were young and had some good role models there, most did not have anyone to call mom or dad. Then they moved to Espere Kay. Now, when we enter the school yard or they introduce a new friend, you can see the joy on their faces to be able to say, "That's my Mom or my Dad!" We are here to help support, to encourage, to love, to correct as needed, and so on. There is a bond between us (especially after living together for over one year) that can only be explained by the love of Jesus. They look to us as the heads of a household where everyone works together to make a safe, comfortable home to live in. Is life perfect here? No, but is life perfect in any family setting? We have our challenges but, in the end, the love triumphs. This is a great picture of the love God has for us. Though we were orphans, our heavenly Father adopted us who believe in His Son into His family with all the rights and privileges. Eph 1:4 – 5: "For He chose us in Him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in His sight. In love He predestined us to be adopted as His sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with His pleasure and will." What happens when we mess up? God, by His loving grace, corrects us and forgives us. Pro 3:12: "because the Lord disciplines those He loves, as a father the son He delights in." It's the same here at EK. We use the Word of God to correct and renew a right heart. Heb 4:12: "For the Word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart." If you ever have the chance to visit us here at Espere Kay, you will meet a group of people who are not perfect but who love Jesus. You will enter a home where we worship the King of Kings and together, as imperfect sinners, we are learning to love as Christ loves us. Rom 5:8: "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."



Almost every Tuesday and Thursday you can hear beautiful praises ring out from downstairs at EK. Stevenson and his group FJM, lead by Frantz Junior Moise, have practices that often turn into praise parties. Occasionally they have Bible Study and sometimes they just worship. The group is made up of about 15 -20 people who sing and play a variety of instruments such as saxophone, cello, piano, guitar, etc. While the team from up north was visiting us they had the opportunity to attend one of the practice sessions. Some said it was the most beautiful worship music they have ever heard. The group is in the process of putting together a music video of the song, "No Longer Slaves," sung in French. They have been recording in a studio and hope to have the video finished sometime in November. We will keep you posted!



Bible Study Update

As we have entered into a new school year, we decided to begin a new study with the voung adults. We are looking at the difference between our cultures and the Bible. Our hope is to learn more about Haitian culture and what people believe here, to share some of our American culture with the young adults and for all of us to see what the Bible says about our beliefs as Christians. We also hope to increase the young adults' Christian worldview, taking a look at what other faiths believe and comparing it to what we believe. It has already been eye opening to learn that Voodoo is still the dominating belief here and that living as a Christian is very counter culture. We learned a proverb that says "en pye anndan, en pye devo." It means one foot inside, one foot outside." This is how many Haitian's choose to live. Although they may call themselves Christians they are still following some of the traditions of the Voodoo Culture. They are trying to live both at the same time. We shared with them that this is not unlike our American culture today where people live with one foot in the world and one foot in Christ. We talked about how all of us as true Christians should be living according to the Word of God alone. Mat 12:25b: "Every kingdom divided against itself will be ruined.", and, Matt 12: 30a: "He who is not with Me is against Me."
